Families

This checklist is organized by families; birds under the same heading are closely related.

Season

Birds on this Havenwood's list may be year-round residents, summer residents, winter residents, or seasonal migrants. Birds follow their own calendar. A

"summer" bird might arrive in spring and stay until fall. Likewise, a "winter" bird will probably arrive in fall and stay until spring. A "■" indicates the time of year you are most likely to see a particular bird. An "×" indicates you *might* see the bird during the indicated season, but such a sighting would be rare.

Nests

A "√" indicates that the bird nests at Havenwoods.

These records are not complete. If you are an experienced birder and have witnessed a bird nesting here, please let us know.

Abundance

Likely to see – You are likely to see these birds if you visit at the right time of day in the right season **and** look in the right habitat.

Lucky to see – Consider yourself lucky if you see these birds! Be sure to visit the right habitat/s at the right time of day and season.

Unlikely to see – Sightings of these birds at Havenwoods are rare. Some birds were blown here by the winds of chance; others have been recorded only a handful of times in the last five years.

Habitat

The letter codes indicate the areas where you are most likely to find different birds. Of course, many birds prefer the places where two habitats meet (edges), and Havenwoods is full of edges!

- **W** Watery places like ponds, wetlands, and creeks.
- **G** Open grasslands or areas where there is more grass than there are woody plants.
- T Wooded areas or areas with an abundance of trees and shrubs.
- C Backyards, parks, vacant lots just about every green place in an urban area.

 - T Wisconsin Threatened Species
 - Wisconsin Species of Greatest Conservation Need
 - NN Wisconsin Non-native Species
